President's Message

Boy, oh boy, oh boy! There is not only **no snow**, but how about winter???

We've only had one cold spell. A few newsletters ago I was talking about the trails and everything and I mentioned that the single most important thing about a snowmobile club was the trails. You know, no trails, no club. Well, I can even dwell deeper than that. Dum Dum overlooked something even more important than the trails... **no snow, no trails.**

Anyway, with no snow people will be looking to trailer over to the lake and run on that. But before you

do, there are a few things you should think about. Without snow, watch your sled temperature and the good chance you have of ruining your slides.

The mild weather that has marked the winter of 2011-2012 has made ice even less predictable. Contact local businesses to ask about ice conditions on the lake or river you want to ride. Learn about the water you are going to ride on and whether the lake has inlets, outlets, or narrows that have currents known to thin ice. **Do not go out alone.** Carry a cell phone and let someone know

where you are and your expected return time.

Carry a couple of spikes and a length of rope in an easily accessible pocket to help pull yourself or others out of the water. Do not travel in unfamiliar territories. Look for clear ice with a little snow on it which is generally a little stronger. Watch for pressure ridges or ice heaves. These can be dangerous due to thin ice and open water and might be an obstruction you could hit with your snowmobile. And last do not travel under bridges.

Think Snow! Let's Ride!
